Best Practices for COVID in 2022

- Maximize vaccinations
 - Protect employee health
 - Vaccinated employees don't need to quarantine – less work loss for all

Best Practices for COVID in 2022

- Promote booster shots to keep employees as healthy as possible and minimize sickness
 - Protect the health of employees
 - Lessens the impact on business from short crews and sick leave

Best Practices for COVID in 2022

- Use KN95 masks or better

Best Practices for COVID in 2022

- Continue physical distancing of unvaccinated AND vaccinated employees when possible until case numbers go down significantly.

Best Practices for COVID in 2022

- Manage isolation and quarantine well
 - Communicate with sick employees to enable them to know when it is safe to return to work, and to make sure that they are symptom-free and use a COVID home test at the 5-day mark to make sure they don't return too early and infect other employees.

Best Practices for COVID in 2022

- Offer testing and home tests to employees and make them available for vaccinated employees who are exposed.

Best Practice for COVID in 2022

- Make KN95 masks available to all employees to use at their option
